Instructions

- To start a new game, click the "reset" button on the board slide. This will reset the board, set each player's score to 0, and randomly move the Daily Double.
- Click "Adj Scores" from the board to manually change scores.
- Click on the lights at the bottom to start a countdown (click below to change).
- Incorrect response: Click the "incorrect" button if the player responds incorrectly, and their score will subtract.
- Correct response: Press the "correct" button if the player responds correctly, and the correct response will then be shown.
 - To skip viewing the correct response, check the box below
- If no one gets the question correct, press the arrow to go to the next slide (or return to the board if the checkbox below is checked).
- Troubleshooting:
 - Do not delete the value shape (e.g. \$400) from any slide. If you don't like it, you can move it off the screen, but DON'T DELETE IT, and don't change its text!!!
 - Do not delete question slides and copy them in from somewhere else. You can do this to replace "answer" slides, but just not question slides (unless you re-apply the hyperlinks to the board)
 - If none of the functions are working, see <u>"Macro Troubleshooting"</u>

Patient safety event that resulted in harm to a patient

What is an adverse event?

An event that reaches the patient but did not cause harm

What is a no-harm event?

Patient safety event that did not reach the patient

What is a close call or good catch?

A comprehensive systematic analysis used to identify the factors that underlie a sentinel event

What is a root cause analysis?

An occurrence that results in either severe temporary harm that required interventions to sustain life, permanent harm, or death

What is a sentinel event?







Diphenhydramine, meclizine, and promethazine are examples of this therapeutic class that should be avoided in older adults

Watch out for Grandma!

What are antihistamines?







This vaccine is used to prevent shingles and postherpetic neuralgia in those age 50 and older

Watch out for Grandma!

What is the zoster vaccine (recombinant) (Shingrix®)?

Although often used in managing delirium, this therapeutic drug class carries a black box warning for increased morbidity and mortality in elderly patients with dementia

What are antipsychotics?







Characterization of inattention, disorganized thinking, acute onset, and fluctuating consciousness

What is delirium?

This property of opioids commonly leads to urinary retention in elderly patients

What is an anticholinergic?







Misplacement of this number after a decimal point or absence of this number before a decimal point can lead to an inappropriate dose

The use of this technology has helped reduce errors when administering medications to a patient

What is barcode scanning?







Fentanyl patches should be used in these types of patients who have previously taken high doses of prescription opioids

What is long-term chronic pain?







To reduce the risk of intrathecal administration and fatal neurological effects, vinca alkaloids should be dispensed in this

What are minibags?

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The National Coordinating Council for Medication Error **Reporting and Prevention** defines this category as an error that occurred which may have contributed to or resulted in the patient's death

What is I?







A common cause of medication errors for patients prescribed U-500 insulin is drawing up U-500 insulin in this syringe

What is a U-100 syringe?







The WHO defines this as "the routine use of four or more over-the-counter, prescription and/or traditional medications at the same time by a patient"

What is polypharmacy?







According to the 2018-2019 ISMP Best Practices, this is required to remind healthcare professionals to verify an appropriate oncological indication for all daily oral methotrexate orders

What is a hard stop verification?





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In order to prevent potential medication errors, oral liquid medications that are not commercially available in unit dose packaging should be dispensed by the pharmacy in this form per the ISMP Best **Practices**

What is an oral or ENFit syringe?









A breakdown in this activity is cited as one of the most common root cause of sentinel events

What is communication?

<USP 800> updates will be in effect on this date

What is December 1st 2019?

Containment secondary engineering control used for compounding sterile and nonsterile hazardous drugs must have this type of ventilation

What is external?

Environmental wipe sampling for hazardous drug surface residue should be performed this frequently

What is initially as a benchmark and at least every 6 months, or more often as needed, to verify containment?



What is 5 to 7 days?

A situation in which a sufficient proportion of a population is immune to an infectious disease (through vaccination and/or prior illness) to make its spread from person to person unlikely

What is community immunity or herd immunity?

What is the Do Not Use list?







Sustained-release, extended-release, slow-release, and long-acting are some medication examples that belong on this list by the ISMP

Learning the lingo

What is the Do Not Crush list?





This list contains abbreviations, symbols, and dose designations which have been reported through the ISMP as being frequently misinterpreted and involved in harmful medication errors

Learning the lingo

What is the Error-Prone Abbreviations list?





This list is another name for the look-alike and sound-alike name pairs of medications

What is the Confused Drug Names list?

What is disinfecting?





This is a test used to qualify aseptic technique of compounding personnel or processes, and to ensure the processes used can produce a sterile product without microbial contamination

What is a media-fill test?

USP <797> was first introduced in this year

What is 2004?

A critical area within the ISO Class 5 primary engineering control where critical sites are exposed to unidirectional HEPA-filtered air, also known as first air

What is a direct compounding area?

Acetylcysteine (Acetadote®) is used to treat the overdose of this medication

What is acetaminophen (Tylenol®)?

Reversal agent for diazepam (Valium®)

What is flumazenil (Romazicon®)?

The Poison Control Center's phone number

What is 1-800-222-1222?

Centruroides immune F(ab')₂ (equine) (Anascorp®) can be used when a person has been stung by this

What is a scorpion?

1 mg of protamine neutralizes approximately of heparin

The formal process for creating a complete and accurate list of a patient's current medication list and comparing it to their record or medication orders

What is medication reconciliation?
