Collaborative Drug Therapy Management (CDTM) in New York State



- Formal partnership between pharmacist and physician
 - Manage patient's disease state using drug therapy under agreement
- 48 states have CDTM laws for Pharmacists
- CDC and AMA have recognized impact of pharmacists in collaborative agreements on patient care





Pharmacy Automation and Technician Workflows

Pharmacy automation has been shown to reduce medication errors and Pharmacist and technician time to all them to perform to the highest degree of their license and certifications

- Automated IV Compounding Robot
 - Restocking compounding supplies and IV medication components
 - IV batching

Preparation medications for pharmacist verification before PillPick® restock

- Overwrapping unit doses (restock)

Restocking and dispensing bulk items





Swisslog PillPick and BoxPicker

- PillPick
 - Provides unit-dose packaging, storage, and dispensing in one robot
 - Pharmacist provides check prior to unit dose of item
 - Multiple checks throughout the system ensure accurate component is dispensed
 - Machine will sort returns and keep par levels for ordering
- BoxPicker
 - Only allows users to access one box at a time, thus decreasing medication errors
- NYPQ runs automated dispensing cabinet refills through technology.
- Technology has increased operational efficiency
 - Pharmacist spend less time checking
 - Technicians spend less time pulling medications/ sorting returns
 - Buying team has real-time inventory numbers
- Results in less time spent by pharmacists checking correct doses








Gravimetric IV Workflow Management System (IVWMS)



- Utilizes gravimetric analysis, barcode verification, and image capturing with hard stops to streamline compounding process
- Program helps with regulatory compliance (USP 797 and 800)
- Program helps with inventory management, prompts compounders to utilize open vials and returns. Compounding list updates in real-time preventing users from making doses that are discontinued
 - In 2020, saved NYPQ over 90 minutes of compounding time per day and approximately \$200,000 in drug spend



Gravimetric Preparation





Volumetric preparation

variation due to syringe deviation/visual error



Prescribed dose

Volumetric analysis — utilizing the markings on a syringe to visually measure the amount of liquid being added or removed during IV compounding.

Gravimetric preparation

variation due to balance deviation




Prescribed dose

Gravimetric analysis — the process of utilizing a known specific gravity to quantitatively determine the amount of a substance based on measured weight.




